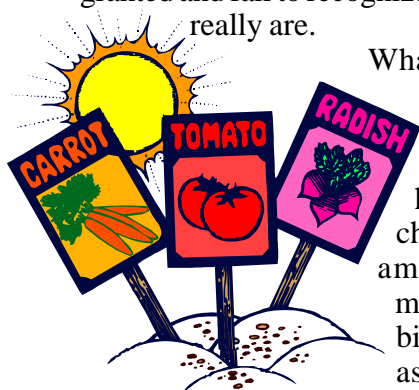


## Pastor's Corner

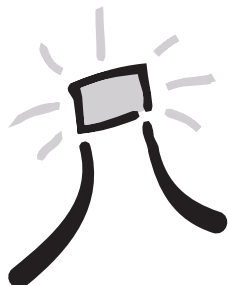

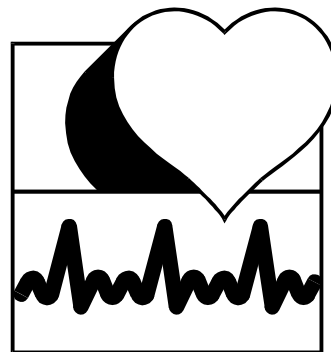
What is happening the last several weeks behind our church is an example of a miracle every bit as dramatic as almost anything you will find in the Bible.

## "Life Line Screening" Set For August 18

Auburn Seventh Day Adventist will be hosting a Life Line Screening on Monday, August 18th 2008. Life Line Screening will offer three different Doppler color-flow ultrasound screenings and two others for people 40 years old and older:



- 1) A Carotid Artery/Stroke Screening – which looks for plaque buildup in the carotid arteries, which can lead to a stroke. (Up to 75% of all strokes are linked to carotid artery blockage);
  - 2) An Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm (AAA) test – which checks for an aneurysm (enlargement) in the abdominal aorta that could lead to a ruptured aortic artery. The majority of people who have an abdominal aneurysm have no symptoms and the mortality rate for a ruptured AAA is about 80-94%;
  - 3) An Ankle Brachial Index (ABI) – which screens for Peripheral Arterial Disease or PAD in the lower extremities. Peripheral Arterial Disease is a strong predictor for heart disease.
  - 4) A screening for Atrial Fibrillation (Afib) a type of ir

# Grossly Ignorant Men

This quote from Oswald Chambers has been on my mind for some time now and it keeps disturbing me. "The reason why the average Christian worker is only the average Christian worker is that he or she will remain grossly ignorant about what he does not see any need for. All of you have intelligence, and you must use it for God." The subject of the statement is "the average Christian worker" but other subjects could be placed in the statement like, man, woman, teenager, child and apply to each of them as well. For the question that challenges me is, "Is there any subject I remain grossly ignorant about because I see no need for it?" I know that this has been true about me in the past. I have been ignorant about my emotional nature and ignored it and just like an ignored child my emotions acted out. And I saw no need to understand and grow in my emotional character. I saw no need and was ignorant about finding safe people to share my struggles with and so my struggles went on and on in isolation. I saw no need and was ignorant about my real identity and was tossed about by many options and teachings. So I still want to be willing to be lead to see that which I see no need for. Is this true about you?

"As iron sharpens iron, so one man sharpens another." Proverbs 27:17 As a man, am I aware of what needs sharpened in my life or do I remain grossly ignorant because I just do not see any need for it? More importantly, do I see the need for other men in my life in order to provide the friction of honesty so that my dull skills and character can be strengthened and honed? Jesus said, "The eye is the lamp of the body. If your eyes are good, your whole body will be full of light. But if your eyes are bad, your whole body will be full of darkness. If then the light within you is darkness, how great is that darkness!" Matthew 6:22,23 Often in discussion about character and growing in a righteousness life, what is discussed is what we see but here Jesus is talking about how we see. etables. And they also began to dream of ways to teach our clients life and work skills so they could get out of the cycle that keeps them needing help. Out of their prayers grew the idea of “The Garden.” From the moment they first caught God’s vision of the possibilities, things really started to happen and a large garden began to take form in the rocky ground above the back parking lot.

Under Mas Masumbuko and John Lascoe’s leadership, the site was laid out and a local contractor donated a backhoe and driver to dig trenches for the rows. These were filled with top soil sold to the church at cost by another local business, then spread using a Bobcat donated by another local business, and finished by still other volunteers. A local nursery offered well over 1000 plants and seeds and another area businessman provided a chain link fence to keep out the local rabbits and deer. One of our Community Service clients who had a background in irrigation offered to lay out and construct the irrigation system provided by another area business specializing in pipe and irrigation supplies. A local plumber heard about the project and stopped by to offer his services, while PGE offered chips for between the rows and a local waste treatment company offered some of the best mulch available on the market as a gift. A representative of the County Extension Service heard what was going on and offered their services and a teacher in the local school system dropped by to ask if she could bring students from local area schools. And some of our clients began volunteering and helping to rake and hoe and shovel to help it come together. A church member offered the use of his tractor and another church volunteer used it to clean up the perimeter of the garden (and to mow the shoulders of Rock Creek Road down to Highway 49). Now people are beginning to dream of a greenhouse so that we can grow and provide food for those we serve year round. And, judging by how things have gone so far, I would expect it to happen.

Another miracle is taking shape in the expanding ministry of our Community Services Department. Several of our members began asking how we could help those we see

every week who are slaves to substance abuse. Two of our members, former substance abusers themselves, with a background in Alcoholics Anonymous, begin to dream of starting a 12 step ministry for our clients. Again, God began opening doors, and within the next few weeks, we are beginning a Sabbath morning ministry in the classroom next to the kitchen in the multi-purpose room. The homeless and others with substance abuse issues are going to be invited for breakfast every Sabbath morning and then encouraged to stay for a 12 step group meeting to help them learn ways of being victorious over the chains that bind them in their addictions. We are going to get to see God continue to work miraculously as He frees people for a better life. It is our prayer that they will see that the Auburn Seventh-day Adventist Church is a healing place where they can get to know God and will want to start attending our church services after the 12 step meetings.

Also on the horizon is a dream of our Community Services Director and some of our staff to start life skills classes for our clients where they can learn the life skills necessary to better function in our society and to break the cycle of poverty that keeps so many of them trapped in their current circumstances.

Jesus has a heart for those in need - so much so that He said that when we help them we are helping Him. I think that He is pleased with the help He is getting, aren’t you?

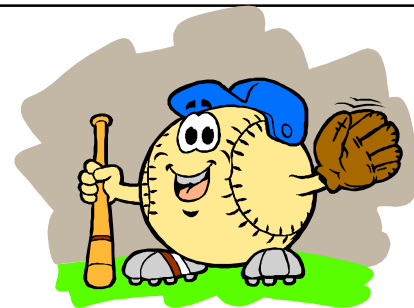

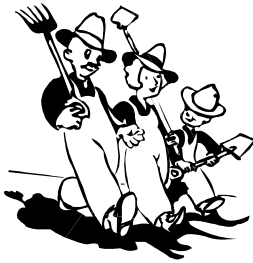

## The Awakening

May 2-4, 2008 was the 20th Annual Christians Men's Retreat at Leoni Meadows. I was happy to be a part of this great event. But I came with a questioning mind – Who was this Herb Montgomery? What did he have to teach me, and the 250 other men that were there? And when I learned that he was only 32 years old, young enough to be my son, there was – What did this youngster have to teach an old dog, like me?

The theme of Mr. Montgomery's weekend was “**The Awakening.**” At the first session Friday night we learned that the question for all of us was “**Who do you see?**” He meant of course, how do

you picture God, personally? I had written a poem once trying to describe the character of God by analyzing the Ten Commandments. I soon learned from Mr. Montgomery, the fallacy in this approach was in my view of God as a lawgiver. I was not the only one with this false impression of what God was like. Mr. Montgomery pointed out that our misunderstanding of God's character goes all the way back to the very beginning of human history, the Garden of Eden.

Religions today primarily focus on their adherents' behavior. But, our behavior is the byproduct of how we think and feel, which is determined by what type of being we perceive God to be. To focus on behavioral change while ignoring one's perception of what God is like, is futile. One springs forth from the other. Please see “*The Awakening*” on page 5.

Our perception of God is critical and at the very heart of whether or not we experience the fulfillment and meaning in life that we long for.

### **Seeing — Thinking — Feeling — Behavior**

Somehow in my mind, I had always pictured God with a different personality than His Son Jesus. God was the Father, the lawmaker, the judge and the ultimate authority figure. Jesus was the intermediary, our advocate here on Earth; He was kind and gentle “The Lamb”. Mr. Montgomery pointed out John 4:9 – Jesus said to him, “Have I been so long with you, and yet you have not come to know Me, Philip? He who has seen Me has seen the father.”

Of course Adam and Eve and the rest of us, had a little help arriving at this misconception of what God was like. Satan was in effect, calling God a liar.

Jesus’ primary purpose on coming to this planet was to infuse a correct picture of God into our understanding of what our Deity is like. Mr. Montgomery pointed us to 1 John 3:8.

Our understanding of God has been marred but not wholly obliterated. A sense of what God must be like still lingers in every one of us. However, God desires to restore to us crystal clear perception through our belief in the description of Himself lived out in Jesus Christ.

That first night, Mr. Montgomery promised each and every man there, that if they stayed for every session, they would go away with a changed perception of what God was really like.

### **Session No. 2, on Sabbath morning was entitled “Ancient Longings”**

In every human being there is often an insatiable longing for we know not what, but simply for something more. Though we may try to satisfy those longings with pursuits that leave us still empty, the longings themselves are actually for God. Our aversion to this truth is evidence once again that we truly have yet to discover what God is truly like.

God is a triunity, between which the ebb and flow of other-centered love (Loving while simultaneously being loved) passes. 1 John 4:8.

The triunity initiated creation with the intent of sharing the existential pleasure of other-centered love. This is why every person longs for, above all else, to love and be loved.

Humanity fell out of the experience of this love through believing lies concerning the character of God. Genesis 3:5.

Jesus came as this triunity incarnate with the intent of revealing the truth about the character of God. Through this revelation He would remove our misapprehension of God’s thoughts and feelings toward us, and restore us to the pleasure of love for which we were made.

We were made for love, and only love will satisfy our deepest heartfelt longings. Ecclesiastes 3:11.

What God desires for us is that our understanding of Him be restored so that we can once again experience the existential bliss of the other-centered love that we were made for. John 8:32.

### **Session No. 3, Sabbath Afternoon “Why Did God Allow This to Happen to Me?”**

Most assume that if God wanted to prevent some tragedy from occurring, He could. Therefore, whatever happens, He must have wanted it to happen for some good reason. This would mean that all things happen for a Divine purpose, or according to God’s ultimate will, following a supposed Divine blueprint. Yet the Bible teaches that not everything happens according to God’s will. Not everything is turning out the way He wants it to. Therefore, it is not true to say that all things happen for a Divine reason, for some events are not God’s desire, or wish.

God made us for love. He can draw us into the experience of love. Yet love, by its very nature is something even an omnipotent God can’t make us experience. Love is spontaneous. The capacity for love, therefore, requires a certain degree of self-determining freedom to love or not to love. 2 Corinthians 3:17.

Freedom, in order to be genuine, must also be irrevocable. Then when things happen that God does not want, He cannot always prevent them. Therefore, because of its irrevocable nature, genuine freedom comes with the element of chance and subsequent risk. Jesus is the perfect revelation of the Father. We can therefore be assured, through Christ, that there are times when God’s lack of intervention is not because He chooses not to intervene but because He can’t intervene. Ecclesiastes 9:11.

The tragedies and calamities we witness and/or experience are not acts of God, but rather acts of God’s most for- Please see *“The Awakening”* on page 6.

midable enemy – Satan. John 10:10.

Satan was created perfect. Pride grew into the slandering of God’s character in heaven with Satan’s intent to exalt himself and depose God.

Because God defeated Satan at the cross, we can be assured that God will once again ultimately drive out this fallen enemy. This will usher in an age of peace and joy without the existence of suffering. Revelation 21:4

#### **Session No. 4 – Sabbath evening, Intrinsic or Imposed**

Sin is inherently harmful. To encounter God is to also encounter ourselves. If any of us were to experience this encounter in its fullness, the end result would be death. Exodus 33:18-20.

Each of use is destined for a full, undiluted encounter with God. For some this encounter will bring healing, for others it will initiate a psychological reaction of cause and effect – a self-realization leading to life-crushing guilt that leads to death. God longs for us to understand that sin produces guilt. Because this guilt, when revealed in the light of God’s goodness and holiness, will reach such proportions that it will crush out our lives under its heavy weight. James 1:14-15.

God’s dilemma was that the very thing we needed in order to be saved (revelation of His character) is the very thing that would destroy us rather than save us. The cross of Calvary stands in solution to this dilemma. Calvary not only restores a correct concept of God, but does so in such a way that we see His great forgiveness. Rather than igniting that chain reaction of self-realization, shame, guilt and death, God’s forgiveness removes our guilt and shame and grants us psychological and emotional peace in a restored relationship with Him. Hebrews 9:14.

#### **The last session: Sunday morning – The Awakening**

God’s solution to our misunderstanding of His character (which leads to our

rebellion, shame and guilt that makes living in His presence impossible) was to voluntarily forgive our trespass. His forgiveness would:

1. Reveal His true character to us, 2. Win us at a heart level from rebellion to love, and 3. Remove our guilt and shame (enabling us to live in His presence once again). But in order to be just, genuine forgiveness must be willingly and voluntarily initiated by the one who was wronged, because it always comes at a price paid by the one violated. 2 Corinthians 5:19.

The forgiveness, rooted in the heart of God and revealed through Jesus’ death will, if believed by the sinner, cleanse our conscience, setting us free from the guilt of our sin, to love and serve God from a new beginning.

The forgiveness of Calvary not only saves us from the guilt of our sins, it effectively dispels our darkened image of what God is really like by illuminating His love. This love awakens in us a reciprocating and resonating response, winning us at a heart level from rebellion to loving service.

Don’t focus on changing your behavior, focus instead on your changed view of God. We were created to experience the pleasure of other-centered love. We assume since we want something, God wants it too. God is not in control of this world, the devil is. God has given us freedom, so He is not in control.

Evil prevails when good men fail to act, not when God fails to act. You can’t have true intimate love with a woman until you experience a true intimate relationship with God.

There are many things that God can’t do: He can’t make us love Him, He can’t make round triangles. He can’t force repentance.

God chose to limit His powers to grant us freedom. If God prevented all sin, we would loose our freedom.

There are three types of events that happen on the Earth:

1. Things God can prevent but doesn’t, 2. Things God can prevent and does, and 3. Things God wants to prevent but can’t, because of the free will he gave to man.

Suggestions on obtaining an intimate relationship with God: Presented by Doug Aramon (Guest speaker at the Seminar)

1. Just sincerely want to, and have an intimate talk with Him, 2. You can connect with God through music, 3. You can connect with God through poetry, 4. Remember you have to take a risk to get into an intimate relationship, when you play it safe; you will never achieve true intimacy with God.

All my questions I had at the beginning of the Seminar were answered. Herb Montgomery, a 32 years old wise man (just the same age Jesus was when he died, someone pointed out) led each man at this seminar to a clearer picture of what God is truly like.

regular heart beat that can lead to heart failure or stroke.

5) And a bone density screening, which tests both men and women for the early detection of osteoporosis.

6) Blood work is also available to test Glucose and Cholesterol for an additional \$50.

You may think that your physician would order these screenings, however insurance companies typically will not pay unless a person has suffered symptoms. Unfortunately, 50% of stroke victims have no symptoms. These screenings are completely painless, non-invasive, and requires about an hour to complete. This is a prevention program, and with early detection, these problems can be treated. The results are sent directly to you and Life Line Screening encourages you to take them back to your primary care physician. All five screenings are \$149. that even if the truth is right in front of us, we miss it. This is what happened when Jesus was on earth and it still happens today.

There is no shame in being ignorant. I got the message growing up that there was something wrong with me because I did not know things, which I had not been taught yet. But how can you be intelligent about something till you are taught and learn about it. The answer is you cannot. But the issue in Chambers’s statement is that I can remain ignorant when there is no reason for me to do so except because of my choice, stubbornness or laziness.

Our Father in heaven has blessed males with the position of “the most excellent of men.” Psalms 45 I challenge you to be willing, open, and courageous in seeing what edges need to be sharpened in your life so you will fulfill your position as “the most excellent of men.”

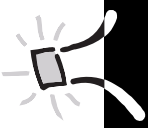
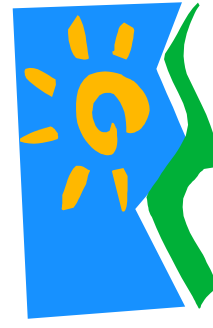
