Sometimes the simplest of songs can carry a powerful message - like the one many of us learned in Cradle Roll:

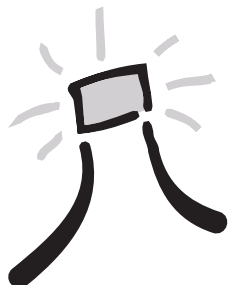
Jesus loves the little children,

Cell Phone Bible Studies

Discovery Bible Guide students can now use their cell phones to learn more about God during downtime at the bus stop or on the subway.

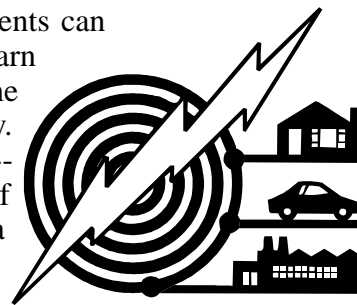
The Discover Bible Guides -- produced since 1942 by Voice of Prophecy, a supporting media ministry of the Seventh-day Adventist Church -- are now formatted for access by mobile Web browsers, a first for the church, says Kurt Johnson, the ministry's Bible School director.

The lessons are expected to find their niche not only with time-strapped commuters, but also in regions where computer access is limited but cell phones with Internet capabilities are widely used, such as Africa, Johnson says.

By capitalizing on new media, the lessons will help keep the church from becoming "obsolete in [its] approaches," Johnson says, adding that he hopes they resonate with the "text-messaging generation."

Banking on convenience, the cell phone Bible studies may connect with people who wouldn't sit down and fill out a traditional paper Bible study or even a computer-based lesson, he adds.

cries she with silent lips.

"Give me your tired, your poor,
Your huddled masses yearning
to breathe free,
The wretched refuse of your teeming shore.

Everyone that I know of in our church and virtually everyone in our county and state and country is the descendent of immigrants. It is one of the things that, more than anything else, has made us great! And what has made the American experiment work is that we are not a melting pot where each new wave of immigrants is fused into one amorphous mass; rather we are most like a stew pot where each vegetable and spice and piece of protein maintains its identity yet enhances and compliments and enriches the others.

The river of newcomers who flowed to our shores over the centuries have not always found the path to incorporation into the American dream an easy one. It generally took each wave - the English, the Irish, the Poles and Italians and Germans and Chinese and Japanese and Czechs and Swedes and Norwegians and Finns and Danes and Vietnamese and Hmong and Indians, and Saudis and Iraqis and Mexicans and Brazilians and Kenyans and Ghanians and Cubans and Egyptians and Mozambiqueans and Ivory Coasters and Nigerians and Inuits and Crow and Blackfeet and Cheyenne and Russians and Croats and Swiss and Jews and Palestinians and Filipinos and Tongans and Tahitians and Spanish and Portugese and a thousand and one others two to three generations to learn the language and leave the cultural ghettos where they first congregated, subsisting on the lowest level of the economic scale until, fed on

the heady elixer of American freedom they rose to take their place in our society. Most if not all faced prejudice and rejection at first, but they preserved and became part of the fabric of this great tapestry we call the “good old U.S.A.”

They enriched our communication as we assimilated new words into the dynamic American version of the English language; they enriched our food and gave us a dazzling array of culinary delicacies; they injected new vigor into our gene pool and constantly renewed our work ethic; they added depth to our educational system and injected color and style to our clothes and skin and variety to our relationships and recreation. In short they, each and every one, helped to make us the great nation we are today.

This Fourth of July let’s celebrate our wonderful diversity; let’s honor it; enjoy it; revel in it; relish it; and thank God for it because it’s what heaven is going to look like one of these days. And let’s honor the Providence who led us all to these shores and who guided men like Washington and Jefferson and Adams and Franklin as they revolutionized what a nation could be like forever. One of the people most admired by Charles Swindoll is Dawson Trotman, who died after helping to rescue two drowning girls. Says Swindoll:

“When Dawson Trotman passed away he probably left a legacy of discipleship on this earth that will never be matched except perhaps in the life of Jesus Christ Himself. I’ve become a real student of Dawson Trotman and believe wholeheartedly in the methods of discipleship that he taught and emulated throughout his days. He died in Schroon Lake, New York. He died of all things in the midst of an area he was expert in—he drowned. He was an expert swimmer. The last few moments he had in the water he lifted one girl

out of the water. He went down and got the other girl and lifted her out of the water and then submerged and was not found again until the dragnet found him a few hours later...*Time* ran an article on Trotman’s life the next week, and they put a caption beneath his name, and it read, ‘Always Holding Somebody Up.’ In one sentence, that was Trotman’s life—investment in people...holding them up.”

Discipleship is not having others follow you as much as it is lifting others up to see the Lord and then serving them so they can follow Him wholeheartedly.

fering symptoms so they are usually not ordered as part of a medical preventative care program.

The screenings are completely painless and require about an hour to complete. Test results are sent directly to the patient to present to a primary care physician for follow up should the results reveal possible health problems. The cost for all five screenings is \$149. Blood work to test glucose and cholesterol are available for an extra \$50. Preregistration is required. Call 800-324-1851 to reserve your appointment.
