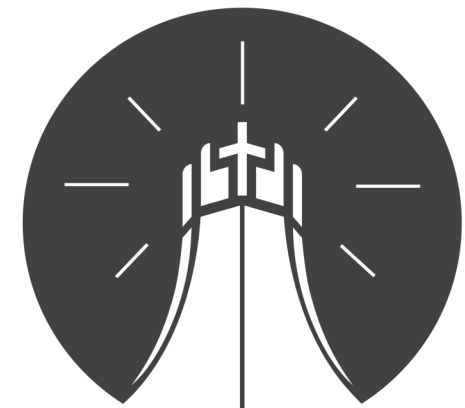

GUIDELINES FOR A SAFE WORSHIP SERVICE

We are happy you have chosen to worship with us today. In an attempt to maintain your safety and the safety of those around you, kindly abide by the following COVID guidelines:

- If you feel sick please stay home, contact your doctor for advice, and worship with us using the live Facebook feed at facebook.com/auburnsdachurch
- Maintain a minimum of six feet social distancing from people outside of your family unit.
- Refrain from shaking hands, hugging, fist bumping, or elbow bumping people outside of your family unit. A simple “Happy Sabbath!” greeting will be much appreciated.
- Wear your mask at all times over your mouth and nose while in the building and in the courtyard. If you need to remove your mask for any reason, please go outside away from others.
- Sanitize and/or wash your hands frequently. We have provided complimentary hand sanitizer throughout the building for your convenience.
