Penne with Fennel

From Better Homes & Gardens—Healthy Recipes

Ingredients:

6 Ounces dried penne (mostaccioti)

2 medium fennel bulbs

1 tablespoon olive or cooking oil

1 tablespoon margarin or butter

3 cloves garlic, minced

1/4 teaspoon crushed red pepper

1 cup red/and or green sweet pepper

1—15 ounce can great northern beans

1/4 teaspoon dried thyme

Crushed ground pepper to taste

1/4 cup shaved or shredded parmesan cheese

Directions:

- 1) Cook penne according to package directions. Drain pan and return penne, keep warm.
- 2) Cut off upper stocks of fennel bulbs. Cut bulbs lengthwise into quarters. Remove cores & cut into thin strips.
- 3) In another skillet heat oil and margarine or butter. Cook garlic over medium heat for 30 seconds. Add fennel and crushed red pepper; cook and stir for 5 minutes more. Add sweet peppers, cook for 3 more minutes. Add beans and thyme; cook about 2 minutes more or until heated through.
- 4) To serve, add fennel mixture to hot cooked pasta; toss gently. Season to taste with black pepper. Serve with parmesan cheese. If desired garnish with left over fennel leaves. Makes 4 servings.
