## Jan's Healthy Recipes

### Cherry Tomato Mozzarella Sauté

From *Taste of Home, Vegetarian Made Easy*

#### Ingredients:

- \* 2 tsp. olive oil
- \* 1/4 cup chopped shallots
- \* 1 tsp. fresh minced thyme
- \* 1 garlic clove, minced
- \* 2-1/2 cups cherry tomatoes, halved
- \* 1/4 tsp. salt
- \* 4 oz. mozzarella cheese, cut into 1/2-inch cubes

#### Directions:

In a large skillet, heat oil over medium-high heat.

Sauté shallots with thyme until tender.

Add garlic, cook and stir one minute.

Stir in tomatoes, salt, pepper, heat through.

Remove from heat, stir in cheese.

Serve and enjoy. Makes 4 servings, takes 25 minutes to make.
