

Fresh Fruit Trifle

From Pillsbury Heart Healthy Recipes

Ingredients:


- ◊ 1 Pkg. Pillsbury Angel Food Cake Mix
- ♦ 1-1/4 cups skim milk
- \diamond 1/2 cup plain lowfat yogurt
- ♦ 1 teaspoon grated orange peel
- 1-9 0z pkg. vanilla sugar-free instant pudding mix
- 4 cups assorted sliced fresh fruit (strawberries, nectarines, grapes, oranges, and/or pineapple)

Directions:

Heat oven to 350° F. Prepare and bake cake mix according to directions on package. Cool completely in pan. Tip on side on cooling rack. Remove from pan. Tear into bide-size pieces.

In medium bowl combine milk, yogurt, and orange peel. Blend well. Add pudding mix. Beat until well blended. Let stand 5 minutes.

In large serving bowl layer half of cake pieces, 1/3 of fruit, and 1/2 of pudding. Repeat layers. Arrange the rest of the fruit on top. Cover, refrigerate at least 2 hours or up to 6 hours. Makes 10 servings.





THE GOOD GROUND

My morning devotion had ended and for an unknown reason, my thoughts were drawn to the parable of the sower and the seed. Perhaps it all began with being unable to pass up a bargain —an influence my husband, Norm, had evidently passed on to me. He had two or three of many items, because he could not pass up a bargain. Sometimes he would purchase an item because he might need it someday, and sure enough, if we needed it, he went to his storehouse to procure it. Recently, I was looking to purchase some bibles and books from Christian Bookstore for the children of the clients that come to our Community Services. It was prompted by an email that I had received announcing a great discount on certain books plus free shipping. I selected three or four books that had interesting titles, being careful to order only two or three of each one. One selection was "The Joy of Giving" about the Bernstein Bears. Another was entitled "The Gift of Love"regularly \$16.99 for \$2.99 (a real bargain!). It was a beautifully illustrated book with children doing various children's activities and the child looking at each to see what he was gifted at, to be disappointed—he did not see that he had a gift. It ended with the good news that he had been given the gift of love. I promptly ordered three or four more of this book. Now, the opportunity arose as a shower was being given to the parents of a soon expected birth of a baby boy. What blessing might their child receive in the future in the sharing of this book, "The Gift of Love". Then I was told that the couple were atheists and would probably throw the book away. Perhaps this was subconsciously on my mind this morning as I was impressed to look at the parable of the sower in Matthew 13. Jesus begins the parable, "Behold a sower went forth to sow; And when he had sowed, some seeds fell by the wayside, and the fowls came and devoured them up; Some fell upon stony places, where

and forthwith they sprung up, because they had no deepness of earth: And when the sun was come up, they were scorched; and because they had no root, they withered away.

And some fell among thorns; and the thorns sprung up and choked them: But other fell into good ground and brought forth fruit, some hundredfold, some sixtyfold, some thirty fold."

It seems the sower was sowing in abandon, not caring where the seed landed. It told me, that Christ came to the Jewish nation sowing "the kingdom of God". He went among all the people with varied responses. We might be thinking that the Jewish religious leaders, the wealthy, the educated political leaders, the people who benefited from his miracles of healing would have been the good ground.

They looked like they had all the advantages of good soil. They had the truth passed down from Abraham.

What was the good ground? A prostitute, lowly and uneducated fishermen, tax collectors, centurions, a Samaritan woman with a colored past, lepers, a woman with an issue of blood, a persistent Greek Syrophoenician woman of the coasts of Tyre and Sidon, a deaf man from Decapolis, demon possessed, the thief on the cross.

Very unlikely ground. What does this tell me? Scatter the seed! and remember that the Holy Spirit is the one who knows where a harvest will spring forth and is responsible for its watering and fruit bearing.

The individual's response comes from the work of the Holy Spirit on the receptive heart. This is the glory of God. Atheists, Jewish Rabbis, uneducated, demon possessed, prostitutes, spiritualists, drug addicts, alcoholics, murderers may seem unlikely ground, but the word of God says, "Not by might, nor by power, but by my Spirit saith the Lord of Hosts".
