### Cranberry Apple Gelatin Cutouts

From Pillsbury Heart Healthy Recipes


#### **Ingredients:**

- 1- 12 oz. can frozen cranberry juice concentrate, thawed
- ♦ 1-1/2 cups apple juice
- 3 envelopes unflavored gelatin

#### **Directions:**

Lightly grease a 13" X 9" pan. In a medium sauce pan combine juices; sprinkle with gelatin. Allow to soften 1-2 minutes. Cook over medium high heat until the gelatin dissolves., stir constantly.

Pour into greased pan. Refrigerate until firm. Cut into squares or other desired shapes with cookie cutter. Makes 48 squares
